BEHIND THE LENS

WHEN DID YOU FIRST PICK UP A VIDEO CAMERA?

"I began shooting video when I was 13-years-old with the family Camcorder, after a surfing accident took me out of the water for a month. From there, I saved up money through a plethora of odd-jobs to invest myself more into making films about surfing, travelling, art, my friends and our adventures growing up."

HOW DID A PASSION FOR FILM TURN INTO PHOTOGRAPHY?

"At the age of 18, I decided to try shooting stills to accompany my videos, and I fell in love immediately. I began shooting anything and everything I could amongst my schedule of school and work. After taking some time to travel, I started receiving job offers via my website and blog, and made the switch to being a full-time photographer. Now, I am fortunate enough to spend my time equally between filmmaking and photography, working with brands such as Apple, Mercedes-Benz, Corona, National Geographic, and the New York Times. I spend as much time as possible on the road, both for work and pleasure, as I'm always trying to shoot something across the spectrum of mediums. When I am home, all my free time is dedicated to surfing, hiking, tennis, art, and my dog, Moose."

WHERE ARE THE MOST MEMORABLE PLACES THAT THIS PASSION FOR ADVENTURE HAS LED YOU?

"By channelling my creativity and excitement into capturing the sea, I have been fortunate enough to take on opportunities to travel the world and visit all of the oceans and as many seas as possible. Tahiti truly wins for its pristine natural beauty; the way the mountains so magnificently meet the sea, where the water is crystalline and filled with whales and sharks – it keeps me awake at night, and when the world-famous wave Teahupo'o starts breaking, you're hard-pressed to find me anywhere else. I also love the Basque Country of France, and the way the Atlantic Ocean sends the storms rolling down its coast in winter. And Iceland and Greenland for their theatrical landscapes and frigid water, which has pushed me to my limits."

WHAT HAVE BEEN THE MOST REWARDING OUTCOMES FROM YOUR TRAVELS?

"Being able to travel the world exploring the oceans has allowed me to connect with so many like-minded people. WHAT TO BRING:



DESIGN TO INSPIRE

XVENTURE PROVIDES LUXURY WITHOUT COMPROMISE, AND ADVENTURE WITHOUT LIMITS. 'SHE WILL BE A GREAT 'STEPPING-STONE' FOR YACHT OWNERS WHO PERHAPS WANT MORE OF A RUGGED YACHT, BUT WITH ALL OF THE COMFORTS OF A TRADITIONAL YACHT.

Exploration, adventure and experiential travel. From dropping anchor in the wilds of Patagonia to navigating America's Cup waters around the Pacific Islands. Being enveloped by nature and capable of cruising anywhere. This is the central premise to the design of Heesen's rugged XVenture – the first of the Dutch shipyard's 'expedition' yachts.

"Being on the ocean and viewing wildlife up close; it's at the heart of the yacht, and was always in mind when developing the project," says Andrew Winch of British studio Winch Design, which conceived the interior and exterior in conjunction with Heesen. XVenture contains an enormous interior volume for her 56.7m length. When combined with her rugged good looks and autonomous capabilities, she captures the imagination of those looking for action-packed adventure in a truly luxurious setting.

XVenture has been depicted as 'less of a rugged Land Rover and more of a luxury Range Rover', a description that is epitomised by her distinct silhouette. "She will be rugged, but refined, with some key signature lines," explains Winch, who likens XVenture's appeal to "the commanding presence felt on the road" when driving a Range Rover. "XVenture will have an equally powerful presence on the water," he says.

The FDHF hull is constructed out of exceptionally tough steel and paired with a lightweight aluminium superstructure. Built to the highest Lloyds Classification and safety standards XVenture is the ideal vessel on which to make extended offshore passages. A remarkable cruising range of 5,000 miles (with even longer range as an optional extra) enables her to reach far off ports and to remain on station longer than other yachts.

Not just built to accommodate rough waters, however, her design pays respect to the oceans and wildlife that she seeks out. A hybrid propulsion system means exceptionally low noise and vibration levels. She also conforms to the latest Tier III exhaust and pollution emission regulations to reduce her environmental impact, while her FDHF hull makes her highly fuel efficient.

On board, she boasts a unique layout, luxurious interiors, and an impressive storage facility for tenders and toys. "XVenture will not compromise on the 'go anywhere' capabilities of an explorer but will combine all of the features associated with a traditional yacht," says Winch. "For us, it is very important for an explorer to have great views from everywhere on board; this philosophy has been in mind throughout the design process."

Floor-to-ceiling glass windows afford views out to sea from the main deck guest cabins and Owner's full-beam stateroom, as well as the upper deck saloon. A spectacular glass-ceilinged winter garden on the observation deck provides sprawling vistas from every angle with a swimming pool forward. Natural light shines through the central staircase skylight, which is directly connected to a second winter garden and aft deck lounging area.

"Everything revolves around being immersed in different environments and making the most of seeing them from different parts of the boat," says Winch, "especially looking forward, to the sides and to the sky."


XVenture's key design feature, however, is the access that she provides to various transport methods for a variety of expeditions, whether it be a helicopter, large tender, jet skis or submarine if the owner chooses. A double height garage accommodates a 11.4m Intrepid 375 Sports fishing boat port-side, with a second 8.6m Beachlander in a side garage; these are unusually large tenders designed to allow guests to move to and from shore in great comfort and variable weather conditions. They are also ideal for carrying extensive gear required for local expeditions. Jet Skis, scuba diving equipment storage, a 4.5m crew tender and storage for fishing equipment and small toys are neatly accommodated, as is the option to carry an Airbus H135 (or equivalent) helicopter to visit remote areas for heli-skiing or heli-fishing.

"XVenture will be a great 'stepping-stone' for yacht owners who perhaps want more of a rugged yacht, but with all of the comforts of a traditional yacht," says Winch. "We are certainly very excited to be involved in such a project."


Preferred length, speed and seagoing requirements are all the information a designer needs to give tailor-made advice about the design possibilities available. Heesen uses an extensive database with results from tests with yachts of every length and shape imaginable. Until recently, this data could only be collected by running physical tank tests on prototypes. Nowadays, these tests are still being performed, but only to fine tune the results from virtual tests using Computational Fluid Dynamics (CFD) software. These


digital tests make it a lot easier to pre-test a design and to assess the yacht's feasibility, allowing the database and product portfolio to progress more quickly.


Extensive menu

Physical tank test









HIGHTECH CRAFTSMANSHIP

Building a yacht is probably one of the most complex processes you can undertake. Few products involve more skills and technology. And in this high-tech era of robots and fully automated production, a Heesen yacht is still largely crafted by hand.

THE DESIGN COMES TO LIFE

The backbone of each Heesen yacht is a hull welded to perfection. It is always a magical moment when the first contours of the hull appear and the yacht's design comes to life. Heesen uses aluminium – which requires highly skilled and experienced welders – and steel to construct. In 2016, the shipyard used approximately 265 tonnes of aluminium and approximately 475 tonnes of steel to build 4 yachts – 2 steel and 2 aluminium hulls.








A PERFECT FINISH

Several layers of epoxy primer are applied to the aluminium and steel surfaces of the yacht, giving the hull and superstructure a smooth finish and a perfect basis for the paintwork. It takes a trained eye and skilful hands to apply each layer of coating and paint with exactly the right thickness.







THE MARRIAGE

The definitive shape of the yacht is determined by another key moment in the building process: the marriage, when the hull and superstructure are joined. It is all about perfect timing and precision when the crane operator lowers the superstructure onto the hull.



As one of the few yacht builders to have an entire in-house department of interior specialists, Heesen guarantees consistent quality and custom design solutions that spark your imagination.

INTERIOR WORKSHOP

The shipyard's main interior workshop is situated in Winterswijk, just over an hour's drive from Oss, and provides more than 8,100 square metres of working space. Here, a large group of craftsmen work on up to five Heesen projects at the same time. This is where all of the luxury areas – such as the atrium, saloon, dining, owner's stateroom and guest suites – are created. At the shipyard in Oss, another 30 craftsmen work on the interiors of all the service areas and sky lounges.

Rather unusually in this industry, Heesen builds its yacht interiors entirely in-house, which requires every type of machinery and skill on location. 'This is something that has evolved over the years and we are very proud of it,' Henry Schreur, director of Heesen Interiors, explains, 'because we have been responsible for many award-winning yacht interiors.' Schreur refers to the acclaimed My Sky, Galactica Star, Elena, Amore Mio and Galactica Super Nova.

This requires a lot of talent. It is one reason why Heesen invests heavily in the acquisition of young talent.

Mock-up

The interior construction process consists of two phases. At first, the in-house interior department generates a four-square-metre mock-up of the proposed interior. This is a full-sized, fully finished interior fitted with handles, switches, lamps and even fabrics and flooring. If the owner agrees with the concept, the interior department then starts creating workshop drawings and sources all the materials, from the exotic to the everyday.


Exquisite materials

Once completed, the interior reaches the second phase – the actual creation process, which starts at both atelier locations. The craftsmen work with some exclusive wood types, including teak, wengé, Macassar ebony, walnut, flamed maple, as well as stained and curved glass, ray and goat skin, 3D printed elements, marble, onyx and other minerals. There are no limits to what the in-house interior specialists can create: the challenge lies in processing the materials in the right way.

Perfect finish

Naturally, raw materials such as bamboo, wood and leather differ from each other in their colour or texture. So to create uniformity, the interior specialists have to carefully treat each piece of wood by bleaching or staining, or colour the animal skin. As well as the material challenge of ensuring every piece looks exactly like its proposed design, weight, dimensions and time are other constraining factors for the craftsman involved. However, even with last-minute changes, these professionals never take short cuts and always ensure that they install everything with a perfect finish.

All of the interior components are created in the wood shops in Oss and Winterswijk and are then assembled and finished on the yacht itself, which requires many different skills for a perfect result.





Engine room






Original Spare Parts & Provisioning

We ensure operational reliability and avoid a delayed or cancelled cruise due to technical failures by offering original components at all times. To be able to offer this, the shipyard maintains excellent relations with all equipment suppliers to make sure that high-quality, warranty-protected and competitively priced parts arrive on time.



REFIT

This pillar was introduced to ensure that Heesen's Dutch quality standards can be maintained throughout the lifecycle of a yacht. Owners sometimes have to fall back on local shipyards and subcontractors when maintenance and repair work is required, This is why Heesen provides managerial assistance on necessary refit, repair and renewal work, either from a distance or on location. A flying squad of technicians is ready to travel at a moment's notice to any location in the world.





CUSTOMER SUPPORT & AFTER SALES

This department consists of a warranty and customer support team. Heesen's warranty team looks after all claims and warranty. Usually, warranty staff get involved a few months before delivery to make sure all parts are in excellent shape when the warranty period begins. Customer Support, on the other hand, provides general 24/7 support to any Heesen client in need, including on location with our flying squad.

More recently, the shipyard launched a new service: the annual survey. This thorough periodical check ensures that yachts are signed off every quarter during the warranty period and annually thereafter. This is a mutually beneficial check, guarding the operational reliability as well as our brand image. This shift from reactive towards preventive and eventually predictive maintenance support means an impressive leap forward in customer service for all Heesen owners.

STATE-OF-THE-ART SHIPYARD

DREAMFACTORY

Ever since Frans Heesen started out in 1978, the shipyard has continuously expanded and improved its infrastructure and docks. Today, it is one of the most advanced and well-equipped yacht-building facilities in the world.

The shipyard is located in the Dutch city of Oss, 150 kilometres inland and connected to the North Sea by a series of canals and rivers.

Its 22,000 square metres of covered area and 2,900 square metres of workshop space offer everything you need to construct a product as complex as a Heesen yacht. Production capacity has gradually increased with the addition of new docks. In 2016, following the success of the 65-metre Galactica Star and 70-metre Galactica Super Nova, a 90-metre shed and dry dock were completed. These new facilities allow the construction of yachts up to 83 metres entirely in-house.
